FLYAWAY GREG STEPS IN AT YEAGER AIRPORT

Due to an increase in wildlife activity, Yeager Airport officials have determined that it would be a great help to Yeager Airport (CRW) to have a seasoned dog on site immediately. Flyaway Greg will be on loan to Yeager Airport until Hercules is fully trained and ready to be delivered. This will help train Airport handlers for the arrival of Hercules, and will jump start our Bird Aircraft Strike Hazard Canine Program. Greg will be on site for a few months. “Yeager Airport is excited to partner with Flyaway Geese on this project,” said Airport Director, Terry Sayre.

Owner of Flyaway Geese, Rebecca Gibson, specializes in training canines to keep birds from nesting on properties as a form of wildlife management. Gibson’s business model offers humane, PETA approved solutions to a specific environmental niche. Flyaway Geese is one of under a dozen businesses in the United States that does this type of training. Flyaway Greg is one of Gibson’s personal dogs that she uses to help businesses across the country reduce the economic and environmental issues related to nuisance wildlife.
